They will enquire what a birthday celebration is for and how we welcome a new baby. They will then contextualise how Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus and reflect on the importance of it.</p>	<p>Concept: Learning From Stories. Jesus as a story teller Children will communicate their favourite stories and discuss why they like them, before moving on to explore a range of stories we can learn from –The Boy Who Cried Wolf, The Hare and The Tortoise. They will then contextualise this by exploring and responding to stories Jesus told. They will think about the special message and reflect on whether they were helpful stories</p>	<p>Concept: Symbols New Life at Easter Children explore what we mean by new life through a Spring walk and discussions of what is happening at this time of year. They will help prepare for a new life celebration and identify some activities which would take place, realising that it is about remembering something special. Children will then move on to explore how Christians celebrate Jesus’ new life at Easter. They make cards, bonnet, cakes etc to celebrate.</p>	<p>Concept: Special.
